
Immeasurably More, *Together*



As we pass the halfway mark of the Beyond Measure campaign, the promise of Ephesians 3:20 is proving true each and every day: **God is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us.** And he is using your generosity as a catalyst to make it all possible!

Since the beginning of the campaign, **more than 940 new Frontline Church Partners** have opened doors of possibility for hundreds of children in each of their neighborhoods in desperate need of hope. Local partners in **27 countries** have revolutionized the way they serve children through the Life Transformation Platform app, which has been translated into **13 languages with more to come.** And urgent, unexpected needs of children have been met with swift solutions, such as **77 million meals being provided to those in severe hunger** and **696,000 children receiving critical medical support.**

Reaching the Next Million

Empowering Mothers to Help Their Children Thrive

For many women living in poverty, motherhood can be as frightening as it is beautiful. Without access to proper healthcare, nutrition or basic education about infant care, moms are often left to face the most fragile season of their child's life without the knowledge or support they need.

But through your support, Compassion's Survival program is changing that story – one mother, baby and community at a time.

Last year, **more than 70,000 mothers and babies received life-saving care** through Survival. From pregnancy through a child's first birthday, mothers were equipped with the tools, training and encouragement they needed to raise strong, healthy children in an environment of love and faith.

In southern Peru, a first-time mom named Yoselin shared how overwhelmed she felt in the early days of motherhood. "I didn't know how to tend to my baby – how to bathe him, how to wash his mouth or what to do when he's teething," she said. But through the Survival program, Yoselin learned essential caregiving skills, gained confidence and discovered a supportive community of other moms just like her. "They also taught us to eat lentils and iron-filled foods. If we stay healthy, our babies will also be healthy."

And her story is just one of many. In fact, **33,841 babies** celebrated their first birthday last year and were able to start the next phases of Compassion's holistic child development program with a strong foundation and a loving caregiver by their side.

Thanks to you, moms like Yoselin are no longer walking alone. They are equipped, empowered and embraced by the Church – and their babies are thriving because of it.

Spotlight on Infrastructure

Building a Firm Foundation

In many communities where Compassion serves, children wake up in homes that are crumbling – built of sticks, mud or scrap metal, offering little protection from storms, illness or harm. These fragile structures aren't just unsafe. They represent years of compounding disadvantage: missed school days, chronic health problems, emotional distress and deep-rooted cycles of poverty.

But thanks to your generosity, children and families in urgent need are receiving more than temporary relief – they're receiving dignity, safety and a new foundation for the future.

Over the past year, your support has enabled our local partners to **construct or repair homes for more than 1,100 families** facing critical housing needs. These efforts include building new, permanent homes and repairing damaged structures with proper roofing, doors, ventilation and sanitation facilities. Each intervention is child-focused and community-led – designed not just to rebuild walls but to restore well-being.

“Before, the rain would come into our house and ruin my schoolbooks. I missed class a lot because I was sick,” shared Richmond from Ghana. “Now we have a real roof, and I don't worry anymore.”

Across Africa, Asia and Latin America, local churches are helping protect children from disease, abuse, overcrowding and weather disasters. These are more than construction projects. They are acts of restoration – laying the groundwork for health, learning, protection and hope. With your support, we're building something that lasts.



“I remember any time it rained, the water seeped into our house, making it muddy and cold. This attracted mosquitoes into our home, which caused us to frequently have malaria and other diseases. I had always desired to live in a decent house but because my family income was little, we couldn't afford a good house. With the financial assistance and our new house, I now look forward to a future with less disease and better performance in school.”

Spotlight on Income Generation

Opportunities to Break the Cycle of Poverty

When the weight of poverty leaves a family struggling to survive each day, any opportunity to learn and attempt a different livelihood can feel entirely out of reach. Parents work tirelessly yet struggle to provide. Young people dream of a better future, but with limited skills or access to income, the cycle of poverty continues.

Because of your partnership, however, Compassion's income generation programming is helping to break that cycle for future generations.

In the past year alone, more than **209,000 youth and caregivers** across Africa, Asia and Latin America have gained access to the tools, training and support needed to build stable livelihoods. Through Compassion's local church partners, participants learn practical skills in trades like tailoring, carpentry, welding, baking, animal husbandry and climate-resilient farming. They also receive support with entrepreneurship, financial literacy, seed capital and mentorship to grow their own small businesses or increase household income.

These interventions don't just improve income – they strengthen entire families. Caregivers are better able to feed their children and support their education. Young people are being prepared for formal employment or entrepreneurial success. Many families now participate in savings groups or cooperatives, building community resilience alongside personal stability.

In total, Compassion invested more than \$9.2 million into income generation and household economic security programs in the past year. And because every intervention is tailored to local context and led through trusted churches, the impact is sustainable, empowering and deeply transformational.

Meeting Needs

Learning Transforms Lives in Tanzania

Ombeni is a coordinator at the Anglican Makiba child development center in northeast Tanzania, one of the churches that began piloting the Life Transformation Platform before its global rollout. He recently shared about what he's learned through the process and how it's impacting their ministry to children today.

"One of the things we've learned is how to best serve the participants," Ombeni shared. "This platform has helped us better understand children and youth and the priorities that need to be met."

When they began gathering data from local families, schools, government agencies and health centers, academic underperformance was one of the most pressing issues that quickly rose to the surface. In response, they set a goal: by using proven curriculums and working with each child to support their unique academic needs, Ombeni hoped to ensure that at least 77% of the youth in the program would have a passing grade (A to C) by the end of 2025.

Not only have they found success by honing in on this issue, but they met their goal faster than expected. **As of September, 80.5% of registered participants have already improved their grades above that threshold.** Today, Ombeni stays in regular communication with children, parents and teachers to continue pressing this progress forward for the good of the children in his care. Responding to Unexpected Challenges

Sustainable Solutions to Drought

This past year, Malawi experienced a prolonged drought that affected millions of people. When their family's crop withered from the weather, a 67-year-old named Florence and her 3-year-old granddaughter Keira survived for weeks on nothing but a small supply of mangos. And they were not alone – hundreds of families in their region were forced to do the same.

"I felt crushed. We looked forward to the harvest for our daily survival, but all was in vain," says Florence. "I looked at my granddaughter with fear bubbling inside, knowing hard times lay ahead."

The local congregation, one of Compassion's Frontline Church Partners, responded to these urgent needs with emergency supplies of food to carry local families through these trying times. But they knew that these weather patterns were becoming more and more frequent and that they needed to find a long-term solution to care for the vulnerable children in their village. They also knew identifying secure sources of food would be essential for the well-being of their community moving forward.

"We are planning new irrigation," says Pastor Davison. "We cannot rely on rainfall forever. We must be able to support those who have nothing to eat."

Additionally, the church is supporting caregivers like Florence with training and agricultural education, hoping to protect them from future seasons of scarcity. This includes providing drought-resistant seeds and teaching climate-resilient farming techniques to help cope with extreme conditions that will eventually come.

Florence is grateful for the support of the church and to be able to send Keira to school with a full belly, both now and in the future.

"When you have food, you are happy. More importantly, you have your dignity," says Florence. "You sleep peacefully and you're not afraid."



Responding to Emerging Opportunities

Planting for the Future

Abbi, 10 years old, lives with her grandmother in the coastal town of Magallanes in the Philippines. This region, located on the southwestern side of the Bicol Peninsula and facing the Pacific Ocean, is prone to flooding and water-related disasters, which have affected Abbi and the other children at the local Compassion center their whole lives.

But Abbi and her friends have an eye for the future, and they are passionate about a simple solution to reduce flood risk in their community: planting mangrove trees along the coastline. Mangroves and other native trees are the first line of defense against storms and rising tides that threaten their neighborhood, and the more trees they can plant, the greater protection they will have. These trees also provide an ecological boost to the local marine life such as fish and crabs, which local families rely on as their primary source of food.

Roselyn, the director of the local Compassion center in Magallanes, supports the children's efforts by securing trees for planting and collaborating with the local government and other organizations to organize events. "Creation care is a form of worship," Roselyn shared. "As Christians and stewards of God's creation, we need to care for the world he has given us."

Roselyn also explained how the church getting involved in this work has had far-reaching effects on the church's influence and reputation in the larger community. "Through these efforts, our church is recognized throughout the town. Our goal is not just to have an impact within the church, but to see the entire community flourish."

Simple investments of time and resources such as this allows local churches to plant seeds of hope and security for the future of the children in their care, while also shining the light of Christ in their neighborhoods today. We're grateful for the ability to empower our Frontline Church Partners to proactively invest in their communities' well-being and in children like Abbi.
