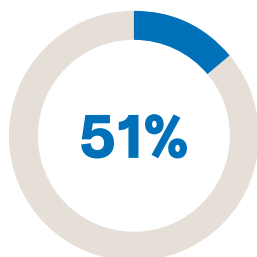

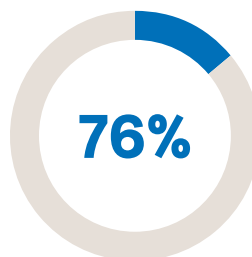

Mothers living in poverty are more likely to experience trouble breastfeeding due to a multitude of factors, including malnutrition and a lack of breastfeeding education and support.

To help mothers overcome these obstacles and help protect the health and nutrition of their newborn babies, every Survival program mother receives breastfeeding education and additional support if they experience issues.
