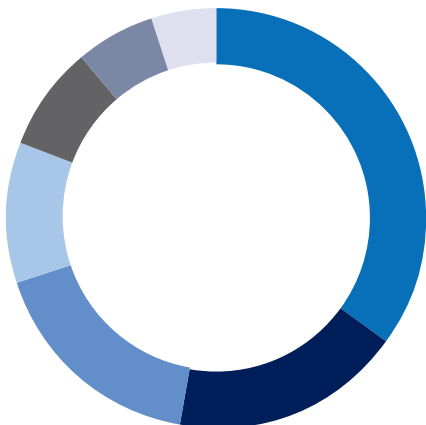

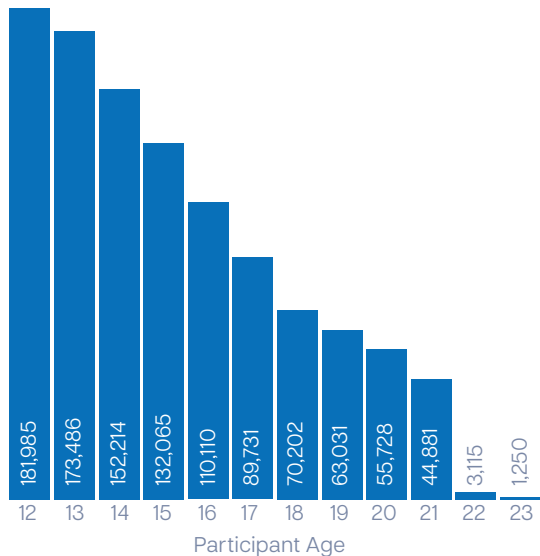

Current Needs and Opportunities

16%

Formal education needs will increase within Compassion's programs by 16% in the next year.

51%

Preliminary Life Transformation Platform data shows 51% of church partners have identified literacy as a top need, and 1 in 4 churches are prioritizing numeracy.

39%

Recent data showed that Compassion-registered youth were 39% more likely to have at least one income-generating skill than similar community youth.



Global Snapshot

- The countries with the highest youth development needs over the next three years are Indonesia (\$11,866,584), Haiti (\$7,781,636) and Uganda (\$6,947,890).
- Countries with a disproportionately high number of youth in their programs are Colombia, Ecuador, Ghana, Indonesia, Peru and Togo.
- All program countries except Ghana, Rwanda and Colombia have incorporated youth development into their five-year strategies.
